UNDERSTANDING BEHAVIOR: SUPPORTIVE STRATEGIES

INFANTS



- · Respond to infants' own schedules.
- Read cues and allow for breaks from the interaction.
- · Hold and provide comfort.
- · Remove from an overstimulating environment.
- · Change an infant's position.
- Talk, sing, and read.
- · Provide favorite objects and toys.

TODDLERS



- Express empathy to let the child know that you understand how the child feels.
- · Talk about and validate the child's feelings.
- Offer alternative behaviors or actions that are more acceptable.
- Provide interesting objects and helpful visuals.
- Offer choices to give the child a sense of autonomy or control.
