

FCCERS-R: SAND AND WATER PLAY (ITEM 23)

Accessibility target:

- Sand and/or water play is provided daily, indoors OR outdoors, to all children between 18 months and 6 years of age.
- Mark this item NA if all children enrolled are younger than 18 months of age.

Considerations:

- Indicator 3.1 requires some sand OR water play be provided outdoors OR indoors at least once every 2 weeks.
- Indicator 3.2 requires close supervision of sand/water play at all times. If any eating or drinking of the play material is observed, indicator 3.2 must be scored no.
- Indicator 3.3 requires at least 2 sand or water toys to use during sand or water play.
- Indicator 5.1 requires sand OR water play be provided at least 1 time per week.
- Indicator 5.2 requires a variety of sand or water toys to use during sand or water play.
- To give credit for a sand/water material, there must be enough of the material so that children can easily dig, scoop, fill, and pour the material.
 - Materials that cannot easily be scooped and poured, such as shredded paper or pine cones, do not meet this criteria.
 - Allowing children to dig in dirt or bark chips, or play in puddles outside does not meet this criteria.
- When using an alternative material such as potting soil or bird seed, ensure that the material is non-toxic/safe for children.
- Children must wash hands before AND after playing with any type of wet material: water, wet sand, etc.
- Sand water toy examples: scoops, funnels, measuring cups and spoons of various sizes, sifters, animals, dolls to wash, kitchen utensils, shovel and bucket, floating toys, cars and trucks, plastic containers.
